TWA: time weighted average airborne concentration over an eight-hour day,

fora five-day working week over an entire working life.

STEL: Short term exposure limit-average airborne concentration per 15 minutes

period.

ENGINEERING CONTROLS

Ensure adequate ventilation at all times. Keep cap tightly closed when not in

use.

PERSONAL PROTECTION

Avoid contact with eyes and broken skin. If spillage or splashing are likely to occur during handling, wear safety goggles. Approved barrier creams may
